

As recently as seven years ago, we could consistently guarantee an undetectable hairline only by concealing it, not revealing it, for example with perms, down and across styling, etc. A detectable, unnatural hairline always resulted in the most inefficient arrangement of transplanted hair because, paradoxically, the hair was
